From the Pastor's Desk

"A Sheepdogs Tale"

tool. Advent calendars teach children to join with the Church in the





An Update On My Ministry Journey Pastor Jeff

When I received my first ministry appointment in 2008, I believed I was doing what I would always be doing in full time ministry as a Deacon in The United Methodist Church. I felt that my part-time appointment to this church (BFUMC) to work with children and families, and my role as a church consultant and resource helping churches assess their ministries and help them determine next steps fulfilled my call. Nothing could prepare me for the adventure that God has blessed me with!



When I began ministry, there were three things I didn't think I was equipped for: pastoral work in the church, pastoral care, and end of life ministries, including funerals. Those who know me best know that those are the three things that have shaped and transformed my ministry! I know now that God's plan for me and my ministry with God's people is bigger than anything I could have imagined on my own.

I now realize that I am called to go even deeper and have declared my intention to transition from an Ordained Deacon to an Ordained Elder. One of the steps toward that is to complete my Master of Divinity Degree. While I have a Masters in Christian Education, I lack some credits for the dual degree. Earlier this year, the Council



of Bishops approved a proposal to allow students to complete their education at Methodist seminaries online, so I have been attending classes since June 2023 and expect to graduate from Methodist Theological School in Ohio, where I received my initial degree in 2008, in May 2024.

As part of MDiv. I must complete a Cross Cultural Immersion Trip to South Africa this January. While the travel details aren't complete yet, I will be travelling with about two dozen classmates to South Africa between January 4 and 21 to participate in a cross section of experiences throughout the country that give us insight into the culture. We will be looking at different religions, traditions, lifestyles, and experiences throughout this two-week journey.



BFUMC has been a huge part of my ministry journey, so I wanted to let you in on this new and exciting chapter. I invite your prayers as I travel in January and this winter and spring as I complete the coursework while of course maintaining my regular schedule as a pastor in the Baldwinsville-Liverpool-Pennellville partnership.




If you would like, come early so you may print your loved one's name on paper and set a framed picture on the altar table before the service begins. Fellowship in the dining room after the service with light refreshments.

Church Giving

If you are not in church, you can continue supporting our church using automatic payments on your on-line bank account or the church's on-line payment system.

Using your bank's on-line bill payment feature, you can set up an automatic payment where your bank sends a check to the church. You control the frequency and amount of the payment. Simply use Baldwinsville First United Methodist Church, 17 W. Genesee Street, Baldwinsville NY 13027, indicate the amount and frequency of payment. Most banks do not charge you any additional cost for this feature.

The church also has an on-line payment system thru VANCO. Go to the on-line church's website www. https://www.bvillefirstumc.org and on the right-side column press 'Online Giving — Make a Donation'. You set up your account and make your donation to the general fund or other areas listed. You will go to a screen where you can enter the amount, frequency of payment and if you want to pay using a bank account or credit card. You will have the option to offset the charge the church incurs for this system.

If you prefer to use a mobile device (cell phone), use the following QR code and it will take you to the on-line payment system from VANCO. Follow the same procedure to set up your contribution as the on-line system. https://secure.myvanco.com/L-Z7C7/home
