

Dear Fellow Church Members,

Thank you for your generous support in 2022 of almost \$300,000. The Church faced a difficult year as costs exceeded income by \$22,906. The lingering effects of the Covid pandemic and inflationary pressures have resulted in less giving's as families struggle to make ends meet.

Despite cuts, the church was unable to significantly reduce costs to respond to the lower income. Total 2022 costs of \$365 thousand were \$21 thousand less than 2021. This included \$19,900 of the church's Shared Ministries to the annual conference going unpaid.

For 2023, the budget has a \$30.3 thousand deficit even after spending cuts. The position of worship leader was abolished, costs for church maintenance/repairs were transferred to the Trustee's and the Housekeeper was transferred to the Nursery School. These three items reduced costs by\$41.5 thousand. Even after these reductions, in order to break even, the church needs additional income or lower costs of \$55 thousand when compared to 2022.

Your church needs your help in this mission by giving a little extra if you can. The Finance Committee will continue work with other committees and the Admin Board to find ways to increase income or reduce costs to meet this challenge.
