
### **SAMASAN**

## **New BFUMC Emergency Action Plan**

The Administrative Council voiced their support for the new BFUMC Emergency Action Plan, developed by the Trustees. All people using the church should be prepared to follow direction in the Plan. Some key points are:

- If an alarm sounds in the church, evacuate immediately! As you leave, <u>help others</u> needing assistance.
- If you are the first to see a fire, pull an alarm (a small red box). Know where the alarms are.
- When you are in a safe place, call 911.
- Once evacuated, safely move to the Charlotte Street sidewalk, *beyond* (*west*) of the church parking lot. Stay there and be accounted for. (People with key emergency information, meet at the southwest corner of the parking lot.)

Copies of the 2-page Plan are available at the table, next the coat rack, near the church office.
